Delta Hospice Society Votes No to Euthanasia

"National and international hospice palliative care organizations are unified in the position that MAiD is not part of the practice of hospice palliative care. Hospice palliative care does not seek to hasten death or intentionally end life."

The Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association and the Canadian Society of Palliative Care Physicians, Nov 27, 2019 In a decision that bodes well for hospices across Canada, the Delta Hospice Society (DHS) in B.C. has voted over 75% to keep euthanasia out of its facility. Last February, the B.C. Ministry of Health defunded the DHS and expropriated their hospice building because they refused to participate in euthanasia. Though the majority of DHS members were against Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD), a number of Board members were attempting to dictate that MAiD be provided.

Last fall, pro-lifers were urged to become members of the Society so they could vote at the next AGM, and they responded in droves. On April 2, 2022, an overwhelming majority of the 5,000 members attending the online meeting voted for a slate of pro-life directors and a change to the constitution to prohibit euthanasia within the organization.

President of the DHS Angelina Ireland said, "This is truly a historic moment for Delta Hospice Society and for the future of traditional palliative care in Canada." This huge pro-life win, brought about by the efforts and prayers of the pro-life community, demonstrates that our efforts do make a difference!






Ad Standards Complaint



A complaint has been filed to Advertising Standards Canada over this billboard, designed to educate the public that yawning begins long before birth. The complainant wrote, "This ad was disturbing to see as it is extremely misleading and can be very confusing for a vulnerable or uninformed person to see," adding that the information on the billboard was not true, that a fetus is not a child, and that the ad features a website that has "frankly very dangerous statements..."



Ad Standards (AS) informed us that they "did not find an issue with the specific concerns raised by the complainant," but they did require "substantiation for the claim, 'yawning since 10 weeks from conception'."

We quickly responded, giving them our source, the trusted and bioethically-neutral, Endowment for Human Development (EHD). AS then re-evaluated the ad and determined that the matter should be adjudicated by their Council.

We have yet to hear their final judgment, but in the meantime, sent them additional material verifying EHD's information, which has been fact-checked by National Geographic and based on consultation with "experts in various fields including embryology textbook authors, a fetal surgeon, professors of embryology and anatomy, and an OB ultrasound pioneer," according to EHD President, Dr. Brian Stillwell.

Dr. Stillwell suggested we make the ad more precise by changing 10 weeks to 9 ½ weeks post-fertilization, the earliest observed yawn, according to a peer-reviewed study dating back to 1982.
